SUBJECT: WET AND PRIMARY AIR TANKS SUPPORTS

APPLICATION

DESCRIPTION:

On the above mentionned vehicles, the wet and primary air tanks supports could interfere with drive axle brake chambers when the suspension is at its lowest position. To prevent possible surface damage to the brake chambers, you must modify the air tank support according to the following procedure.

PROCEDURE

Warning: Park vehicle safely, apply parking brake, stop engine and set battery master switch(es) to the OFF position prior to working on the vehicle.

Prior to working under an air-suspended vehicle, it is strongly recommended to support the body at the recommended jacking points.




FIGURE 1: AIR TANK SUPPORT

- 1. Under vehicle, over drive axle brake chambers (L.H. and R.H. sides), locate the air tanks supports (refer to fig. 1).
- 2. Cut the extremity of each support, located right over brake chamber, under stud and nut (fig. 1). Drill a 3/8 "diameter hole in the support (refer to fig. 1)

Caution: Do not use a cutting torch to cut support.

3. Check drive axle brake chambers for dents or leaks caused by air tank supports. If dents or leaks are detected on a brake chamber, it must be replaced.

Note: If a brake chamber must be replaced, Prévost Car will reimburse you the parts and labour (0.75 hour for each brake chamber) upon receipt of a completed A.F.A. form and of the defective brake chamber. For replacement instructions, refer to Maintenance Manual, Section 12: Brake and Air System.
